## TUMBLE BUG

### Fun Facts:

- The Tumble Bug is one of 4 known surviving in the world and one of two still operational
- Is the last true Tumble Bug with its original cars and glowing eyes.
- Because the center post and footer of the ride drops 8 feet down into the earth, this ride has not changed locations over the years like other iron rides that are much easier to move.
- Built by the Traver Engineering Company in Beaver Falls, Pennsylvania.
- When it was decided to auction the park iron rides in 1993, the Tumble Bug sold for \$1500. Fortunately, the buyers of the ride later bought the entire Park and kept the ride in place.
- The Tumble Bug did not operate for the 2003, 2004, and 2005 seasons.
- The Tumble Bug reopened on July 8<sup>th</sup> 2006.
- Because parts are no longer available for this ride, replacement parts need to be remanufactured from time to time.
- Of the two surviving Tumble Bugs, Conneaut Lake Park's is the oldest
